



Our Philosophy:

At Explorers Early Childhood Education, Inc. we believe that education should be as multifaceted as the children we serve. Our blended model avoids the limitations of a single pedagogy, instead weaving together the world's most effective educational traditions to create a holistic, foundational experience.

The Five Roots of the Explorers Educational Model:

- **The Independence of Montessori:** We utilize the "Prepared Environment" and self-correcting materials to foster deep concentration, autonomy, and a sense of order. Children are empowered to follow their own rhythms of discovery.
- **The Inquiry of STEAM:** Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics are not subjects—they are lenses. We encourage children to ask "Why?" and "How?", using trial and error to solve real-world problems.
- **The Expression of Reggio Emilia:** Our classrooms are filled with natural light and "provocations." We view the child as a strong, capable protagonist, and we use the "Hundred Languages of Children"—from clay to coding—to make their thinking visible.
- **The Resilience of Outdoor Education:** Nature is our co-teacher. Whether rain, snow, or shine, we spend significant time in the Colorado landscape, building physical grit, ecological literacy, and a profound respect for the Earth.
- **The Heart of Civic Engagement:** We believe children are citizens of *today*, not just tomorrow. We engage with our local community through service projects, visits to local landmarks, and practicing the democratic process within the classroom.

Essential Duties & Responsibilities

- **Responsive Caregiving:** Provide gentle, individualized care including feeding, diapering, and soothing, following each child's unique natural rhythm.

- **Classroom Management:** Maintain a high-quality learning environment that meets **Colorado Department of Early Childhood (CDEC)** licensing standards and safety regulations.
- **Outdoor Engagement:** Embrace our outdoor education philosophy by assisting with daily outdoor time, ensuring infants have meaningful, safe daily interactions with the natural world regardless of the season.
- **Observation & Documentation:** Help track developmental milestones and progress through anecdotal records.
- **Family Engagement:** Maintain daily communication with families regarding their child's milestones and needs.
- **Safety & Compliance:** Ensure strict adherence to health and safety protocols, including sanitization, emergency preparedness, and mandated reporting.
- **Bilingual Environment:** Maintain a language-rich environment where **Spanish and English** are used interchangeably to support cognitive flexibility and cultural appreciation.

- **Risk Management:** Knowledge of safety protocols for off-site excursions and outdoor play.

Qualifications & Experience

- **Age:** Must be 19 years of age
- **Education:** High School Diploma or equivalent required (required); Courses in **Early Childhood Education (ECE)** or a related field (strongly preferred).
- **Credentialing:** Must meet Colorado Department of Early Childhood (CDEC) **Early Childhood Teacher (ECT)** qualifications. This typically includes: Colorado Early Childhood Professional Credential 3.0 (Level 2 or higher).
- **Experience:** Minimum of three (3) months (455 hours) of verifiable experience in the group care of infants or toddlers (required). One (1) year of experience in a licensed infant program preferred.
- **Clearance:** Must pass a comprehensive background check, including Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) fingerprinting.

- **Competitive Salary:** \$21 - \$24 per hour (depending on education and experience).
